Lesson 5: Fighting Fair: Conflict Resolution

Text: Luke 17:1-4 | Ephesians 4:25-32

Introduction:

Interpersonal conflict is a reality in the world we live in. We must manage relationships with co-workers, bosses, friends, and even family. If we aren't careful, we will allow walls to be put up between us and those that we love most.

Outline:

- Offenses are inevitable, but we should be cautious not to be an offense to God's children. (Luke 1-2)
 - A. Offenses are inevitable.
 - 1. In a broken, fallen world full of imperfect people you will have offenses in your marriage.
 - 2. There are no perfect marriages.
 - B. We should be cautious to avoid offending God's children.
 - 1. God takes offense against His children seriously.
- II. Offenses are inevitable, we should be quick to forgive those who repent when they wrong us. (Luke 3-4)
 - A. We should forgive others when they repent.
 - B. The frequency of our forgiveness should have no limit.
- III. Christians should live out the reality of the new life they have been given in Christ. (Ephesians 4:17-32)
 - A. The old way of living should be renounced. (17-19)
 - 1. We are no longer to live in darkness.
 - B. Christians should renew their minds as new creations in Christ. (20-24)
 - 1. The old man has been put off.
 - 2. The new man has been put on.
 - 3. So, renew your mind!
 - 4. That is, adopt a new mindset.
 - 5. God wants to transform the intentions, thoughts, and attitudes of our hearts.
 - 6. How, the Holy Spirit of God uses the Word of God to shape the minds of the people of God.
 - C. Christians should live renewed lives. (25-32)
 - 1. We should live lives that outwardly reflect the new inward reality.
 - 2. This includes adopting the spirit and attitude of forgiveness.
 - 3. It takes a renewed mind to live this way.

Application:

- Life in a fallen world means that we will become offended.
 - Offenses need to be handled in a biblical way.
- Life in a fallen world means that we must learn to forgive.
 - o The inability to forgive will lead to a host of personal problems.
 - There are both biological and spiritual problems that will arise from bitterness.
- Take care of problems before bitterness begins to take root.
- Resolving issues takes humility.
- Renew your mind.
 - Read the Scripture to know and love God.
 - o Pray to follow and be conformed to Christ.
 - o Be in close relation with mature Christians.
