Lesson 7: Money Matters: Finances in Marriage

Text: 1 Timothy 6:17-19

- I. Wealthy Christians should take care to maintain humility and trust in God. (17)
 - A. Riches tend to make us proud.
 - 1. "Wealth often gives birth to vanity. It tends to make people feel self-important, and so 'contemptuous of others'."
 - B. We tend to trust riches.
 - 1. Wealth often creates a false sense of security.
 - 2. "The two dangers, then, to which the rich are exposed are a false pride (looking down on people less fortunate than themselves) and a false security (trusting in the gift instead of in the Giver). In this way wealth can spoil life's two paramount relationships, causing us to forget God and despise our neighbor."
 - C. God is the giver of all things.
- II. Wealthy Christians should do good and be generous with their wealth. (18)
 - A. Wealth should be handled rightly.
 - 1. Wealth should be gained and used in a righteous way.
 - B. We should focus more on being rich in good works than being rich financially.
 - 1. Our lives should be more characterized by righteous actions than by the pursuit of wealth.
 - C. We should be generous.
 - 1. We should be characterized by generosity rather than stinginess.
 - D. We should willingly share what we have.
 - 1. Giving should be done willingly rather than by constraint.
- III. Christians who use their wealth wisely store up treasures in heaven and lay hold on eternal life.
 - A. The wise user of wealth stores treasure in heaven.
 - 1. We should be living for the next life not just for the here and now.
 - B. The wise user of wealth lives with the blessing of eternity now.
 - 1. "We lay hold on eternal life as we realize in our souls that we do not belong to this sphere; that everything for us is connected with the scene to which we are going." Ironside

Big Idea: We rightly use the wealth God has given us by trusting in God and by using His gifts righteously.

Application/Discussion:

How do we use what God has given us rightly?

- God neither wants us to be ascetic or self-indulgent.
 - o Enjoy what God has given you, but don't live for luxury.
- Stay out of debt.
 - Live within your means.
- Set a budget and live by it.
- Determine to be generous.
 - o With God.
 - With God's people.
- Be thankful for what you have.
- Don't covet what others have.
