Making Marriage Work in a Broken World

**Lesson 17:** Part 4 Technology and the Christian Life—Entertainment.

Text: Ecclesiastes 9:7-10; 11:9-10 | 1 Corinthians 10:31

- I. Entertainment is a gift from God. (James 1:17)
  - A. God wants His children to be happy.
    - 1. Sometimes we say, "God wants you to be holy, not happy".
    - 2. While there is an element of truth in that statement, it is unwise to place happiness and holiness as incompatible.
    - 3. We wouldn't say, "God wants you to be holy, not to have enough food to feed your family".
    - 4. Holiness is a top priority for Christians.
    - 5. The good news is that you can be both holy and happy!
    - 6. One of the fruits of the spirit "joy".
  - B. The pursuit of happiness over righteousness leads to destruction.
    - 1. We tend to corrupt God's good gifts.
    - 2. We tend to love the gift more than the giver.
    - 3. So long as we keep God's gifts in their rightful place, then we have nothing to fear.
    - 4. When we prioritize entertainment over responsibility, we leave the path of wisdom and enter sinful territory.
- II. What are the dangers of entertainment?
  - A. Idolatry
    - 1. When has entertainment become idolatry?
    - 2. That can be a difficult question to answer.
    - 3. Here are a few suggestions:
      - a. Entertainment becomes idolatrous when it is controlling me.
      - b. Entertainment becomes idolatrous when I sacrifice to/for it.
      - c. Entertainment becomes idolatrous when I ask it to do what only God can do for me.
        - i. "My Phone is My Shepherd"
          - My phone is my shepherd, It promises me everything I could ever want. It makes me lie down on my couch with mind-numbing entertainment. It afflicts my soul with anxiety.
          - It leads me in paths of comparison and addiction for the algorithms sake When I walk through hard times, it promises me distraction and escape. When I face temptation, It depletes me of energy, sleep, and focus leaving me weak.
          - Screen Time and scrolling will follow me all the days of my life.
          - And I will miss out on the presence of the God of the universe, because of the meta-verse at my fingertips.

- B. Worldliness
  - 1. It is no secret that Hollywood and the entertainment industry does not love God.
  - 2. 40% of top billboard songs contain sexual messages.
    - a. Some genres have sexual messaging in up to 65% of their songs.
  - 3. A study from the Western Journal of Medicine had the following to say,
    - a. "As much as 80% of all movies shown on network or cable television stations have sexual content.<sup>2</sup> An analysis of music videos indicates that 60% portray sexual feelings and impulses, and a substantial minority display provocative clothing and sexually suggestive body movements.<sup>10</sup> Analyses of media content also show that sexual messages on television are almost universally presented in a positive light..."
  - 4. VidAngel looked at the overall stats for profanity, sexual content and violence in TV and movies for 2022 and here's what they found:
    - a. 37 counts of profanity, blasphemy and foul language per hour.
    - b. 15 counts of sexual content, nudity or immodesty per hour.
    - c. 13 counts of violence, blood or gore per hour.
    - d. 75 total counts of potentially offensive content per hour.
    - e. There was very little difference in the counts of sex, nudity and immodesty for PG-13 and R-rated films, with 11 and 11.5 counts per hour, respectively.
  - 5. I think it is safe to say that being entertained by what God hates is wrong for Christians. (Psalm 101:3)
- C. Wasted Time
  - 1. Entertainment belongs in a small category of our lives.
  - 2. It must be managed.
- III. Guiding principles in how to navigate entertainment.
  - A. Do all things for the glory of God. (1 Corinthians 10:31)
    - 1. Is what I am entertained by glorifying to God?
  - B. Anything that violates Scripture is sinful.
    - 1. Is what I am watching explicitly sinful?
      - a. Does it glorify or normalize sins such as homosexuality or adultery?
    - 2. Is what I am watching exposing my heart to attitudes and mindsets that are unbiblical?
  - C. Do I live for entertainment?
    - 1. Entertainment should not be the substance of our lives.
  - D. Prioritize the people in your life.
    - 1. Are the people in your life more important than the fun in your life?
